



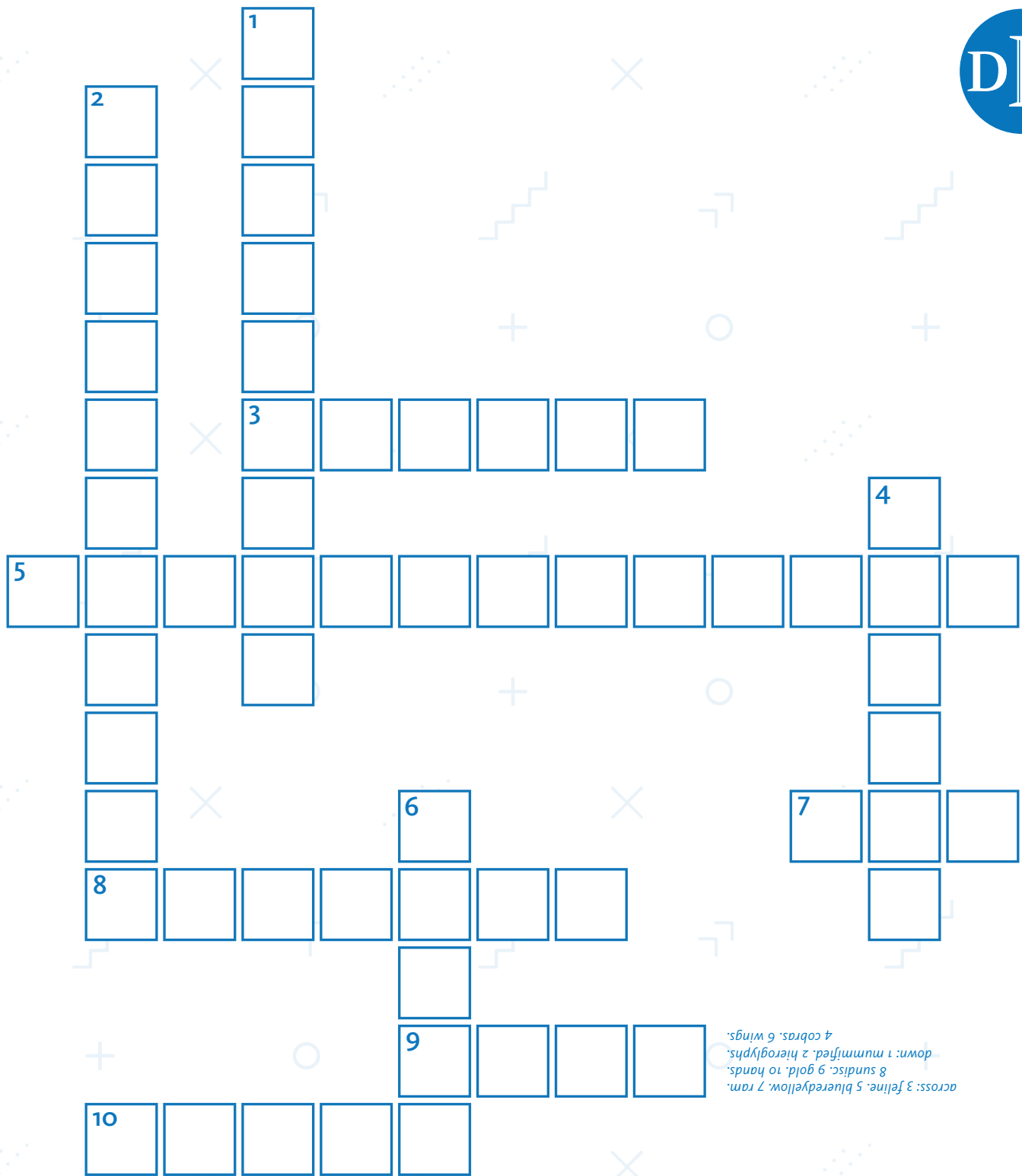
DIA COLLECTION CROSSWORD
